1. Email After Purchase

After purchasing a flight, an email will be sent to the passenger including their mobile boarding pass and a pdf of their physical boarding pass. Passengers have the choice of using the mobile boarding pass or the physical boarding pass.

Nudge: Noting that using the mobile boarding pass will "keep you up to date with flight changes" nudges passengers towards using the mobile boarding pass.





4. Flight Changes

Flight changes will be reflected in the mobile boarding pass. Any changes will be in red. If the passenger provides phone number at the time of purchase, a text will be sent to the passenger stating that changes have been made. The text will include a link to the mobile boarding pass.





Signifier: The red color indicates a change.
Highlighting (color): Red text brings attention to the change

Other elements used-

Performance load: The mobile pass lessens the performance load. When changes are made, passengers are notified in real time and they do not have to make an effort to figure out what changes have been made.

Forgiveness (Good Affordances): Showing changes in real time prevents passengers from going to the wrong gate, attempting to board the wrong flight, etc.
